The goal of basic emergency vehicle training is to train the law enforcement officers for a safe and efficient operation with vehicle.

Emphasize will be on principles and techniques, especially in the laws of motion, vehicle dynamics and drivers response. Principles and techniques are explained in the classroom before students are allowed to participate in actual performance in practical exercises. Under close supervision and guidance, students learn to recognize their personal limitations, as well as the limitations of the vehicle.

The participants will be tested (theory, driving range and practical demonstration in traffic.)

Objectives

After completion of this course participants will be able to:

- be familiar with general characteristics of the official vehicle (parts of vehicle, checking and maintenance of the official vehicle, etc.)
- operate in professional and independently official vehicles enforce law provisions regarding emergency driving and road traffic,,
